COMMUNITY PARTNER AWARD-Sudeep Kukreja, MD, a highly regarded neonatologist, has earned numerous accolades over his decades-long medical career, but what stands out is his commitment to service. As the founder of the nonprofit Arpan Global Charities, Dr. Kukreja has organized 26 volunteer medical missions to dozens of countries, including Armenia, Puerto Rico and Tanzania. Center in exponential growth, ultimately driving our patient survival rates to be among the highest in the nation. His expertise is reinforced by the transplant center's recent recognition as the #1 Rated Kidney Transplant Program in California. He oversaw the our recent designation as a multiorgan transplant program, elevating SJO to a new tier.



LEADERSHIP EXCELLENCE AWARD-Brian Lee, MD, is a steadfast, dedicated and devoted member of our Medical Staff. His drive for continuous improvement inspires everyone around him. At Providence, our care extends far beyond the walls of our hospitals and deep into our communities. Each year, our not-for-profit health organization provides hundreds of millions of dollars in community health services such as essential medical care and resources, accessibility to affordable housing, community hub centers, healthful foods and more.

Across the South Division, Providence, often working with community partners, contributed \$625 million in programs, charity care, unpaid costs of Medicare and MediCal in California, with \$437 million allocated to Southern California and \$188 million in Northern California according to the 2024 Annual Report to Our Communities.
